Humanitarianism

SOTW will give you an opportunity to *Create a Better World*. By helping others, you will learn the importance of working together, and the capacity our generation has to affect positive change.

Creativity

Let your creativity and imagination run wild when you plan and organize public awareness campaigns, training courses, and service projects in Canada and around the world.

Cultural Understanding

Travel to different parts of Canada and the world, experiencing different cultures and traditions, history and geography. Expand your view of the world by getting out there and seeing it.

Career Building

Give yourself that edge ahead of the competition when building your resume and gaining experience that will prove your abilities to employers, all while having the time of your life.

Life Experience

Learn new skills while preparing and training for your service project. Make a practical and lasting contribution to society and humanity during the Voluntary Service portion of the program.

STEP 1: DISCOVERY

During your Discovery, you'll investigate one of the three program categories: development, peace, and environment at a standardized Discovery Base. Specifically, you'll look at the causes and effects of one of the Millennium Development Goals of the United Nations, addressing Poverty and Hunger, Universal Education, Gender Equality, Maternal Health, Infant Mortality, HIV/AIDS, Environmental Sustainability, and Building a Global Partnership. At the end of your Discovery, you'll create your own Action Plan, outlining what you intend to do to contribute to the solution and how you're going to do it.

STEP 2: VOLUNTARY SERVICE

Following your Action Plan from the Discovery, you'll put into practice what you've learned. Spend 60 hours working towards one of the Millennium Development Goals of the United Nations and you're well on your way to the award. You can work on your own, or you can work in a group. You can complete the project in your own community or on the other side of the globe. What's important is that you're *Creating a Better World*.

STEP 3: REPORTING AND RECOGNITION



Once you've completed the Voluntary Service portion of the program, tell us what you did. Outline what you learned and what you did. Where did you go, what did you see? We want to hear all about it.
