RED COAT TRAIL Leadership: Plan-Do-Review



The Adventure:

After every adventure, it's important to review your experience. This is a chance to discuss what went well and why. It's also a chance to reflect on what didn't go to plan, and how you can make things run more smoothly in the future. Finally, reviewing is a good opportunity to reflect on your personal growth and appreciate what you've learned.

While reviewing is important, it can get a bit boring if you do it the same way every time. You can do things a bit differently by sharing your thoughts with one another on a gallery walk. Set up three or four prompts relating to an adventure you've shared as part of this workshop. These can be things that you used as part of your adventure, like a pole or a rope. Circulate around your "gallery" in groups of two or three. Reflect on your adventure in light of the prompt at each station, taking two or three minutes at each. Record your group's thoughts, then share with the bigger group.



Plan:

- What materials do you need for this adventure review?
- How can you **Leave No Trace** on this adventure review?
- How will you divide up the Troop?
- How will your Troop share the reflections of each small group?

Do:

- Go on your gallery walk and reflect on a recent adventure.

Review:

- What do you know now that you did not know before?
- What unexpectedly came up from these prompts?
- Would you use this approach for review again in the future? Why or why not?
- What would you do differently next time?
