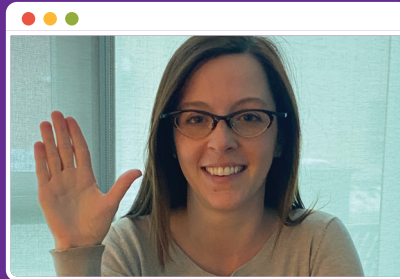


Women & Girls in STEM WEBINAR

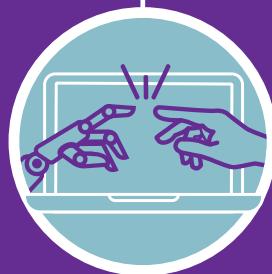


Meet the three scientists from Defence Research and Development Canada



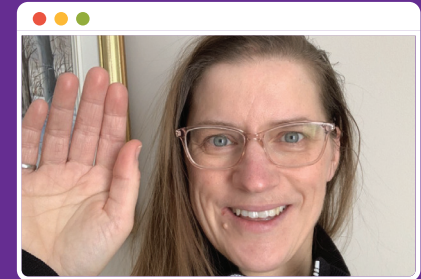
AREN HUNTER

CAROLINE TURCOTTE

Caroline Turcotte studies hyperspectral images, which is a kind of image that records more colours than a typical camera and can be used to find people when they are lost and need to be rescued.
